Ask students: Do you know what type of trees these are?	participate in group discussion	

Each desk group will receive watercolor paper, cups filled with water, watercolor paints and paintbrushes. (Hand out water last to prevent earlier starters before instructions)	Use a special helper to support handing out supplies.
